

Guidelines for Creating the Short Video

Video Contents (Please include all points ①~⑤)

- ① Greetings (e.g., “Konnichiwa”) in your native language
✂Please record your voice, and show your face if possible.
- ② Self-introduction (your department and year of study)
✂For alumni, please include the department during your enrollment.
- ③ About your country or hometown (notable characteristics, etc.)
- ④ "My country's best recommendation is..." (e.g., food, places to visit, etc.)
- ⑤ Best Things or Top 3 Best Things about Kanazawa University
- ⑥ A short message (at the end) *optional



As long as ①~⑤ are included, any style is welcome. You can create the video with friends. Create a fun video to help more people learn about your country!

Points to Note When Creating the Video

- Style: Vertical (Aspect ratio 9:16, resolution 1080px × 1920px)
- Length: Within 60 seconds (strictly enforced)
- Include the country name at the beginning of the video.
- Do not include information that can identify individuals, such as names or addresses.
- Use appropriate language and expressions.
- Add audio or music whenever possible.
- If adding narration, use English or Japanese.
✂For English narration, please submit a script as well.
- Include English subtitles in the video.
- If using music, photos, or images, ensure they are copyright-free.
- If other people appear in the video, obtain their consent.
